-Prior to cargo stuffing commencement, we checked visually the allocated empty containers and found them empty and without any residue cargo.



**DISCHARGING &
STUFFING
SUPERVISION**

-Bitumen drums were discharged from loaded trucks by means of a forklift with adequate man power.

-Each take of forklift discharged 8~12 drums which were directly stuffed into nominated containers. In each container two tiers of drums were stuffed, in first tier **115** and second tier **22, 23** drums were stuffed (Totally **137, 138** drums in each container).

-Under our supervision, **40 x 40 Ft.** containers were stuffed :

**SAMPLING
,SAMPLE
PREPARATION &
DISTRIBUTION**

-Sampling for **40 x 40 Ft.** stuffed containers was performed during stuffing operation from some randomly selected drums.

-A numbers of **18** drums, according to the ASTM Method D-140M-09(Standard Practice for Sampling Bituminous materials) were selected randomly for sampling.

-After drawn samples the said selected drums were stuffed into containers Items: **11-14-39.**

-The drawn samples were poured inside of metal can(s) which was sealed by SGS lab before and delivered to sampler to use for sampling.

-After completion of sampling the all drawn samples were delivered to the SGS preparation lab on **19.03.2025** in order to preparation and distributions.

Notes:

-Due to presenting cargo already packed in drums at the time of inspection, we've been restricted to take the increments from top level of drums only.

-The body of selected drums for sampling was marked as:" **SAMPLED BY SGS**" and "**ITEM NUMBER OF SELECTED DRUMS FOR SAMPLING**".



GENERAL NOTES

-The floor of nominated empty containers was covered by plastic sheet.



-As per declaration by principal representative, the drums were transferred from **Kermanshah** to Rajae port.

-During daily randomly visual checking and as much as possible to check, followings were attained:

- About 15 ~ 20% of drums were suffered from slightly dent on bodies during stuffing operation. (This due to the loading method performed by the man-power and

machine/forklift, which the drums were in the sound condition in an appearance before stuffing into containers).



- Stuffing operation of 40 containers was completed.
